Under the name "Environmental Health and Safety Community University Partnership Project," the Nursing Department of the Faculty of Nursing at Tishk International University (TIU) organized a community service project in partnership with Ishik Kindergarten. Ms. Hanan Azad supervised the project, which took place over two days on November 19 and 26, 2024.

The first day, children were given a thorough general wellness assessment by nursing students, who evaluated their general health and highlighted any possible issues. Following the assessment, the students gave the kids and their teachers thorough guidance on how to make the kids' lives better. These guidelines, which emphasized the need of preventative care and good lifestyle choices, included advice on appropriate eating, exercise, sleep hygiene, and mental health support. In order to guarantee that the child's physical and developmental needs were satisfied for the best possible growth and happiness, the students also provided guidance on maintaining a balanced routine and encouraging emotional well-being.

The second day, children gathered in the seminar hall, where nursing students gave an educational session on promoting health and wellbeing. Important subjects including appropriate handwashing methods, emotional control, keeping a positive attitude, and the value of a balanced diet were all emphasized in the seminar. The nursing students encouraged children to actively participate in the hands-on demonstrations to make sure they understood these ideas completely. Children discussed good eating practices, learned how to express and control their emotions, and practiced handwashing skills.

A thorough overview and in-depth explanations of every important subject were given to the children. In the meantime, they received gifts as well, which maintained the lively and interesting mood.

The success of the occasion was largely due to the exceptional contributions made by our second-grade students. The Faculty of Nursing hopes that this initiative will encourage future students to engage in community service projects and expresses its profound gratitude to all those participating.

They participated in a range of interesting activities designed to foster curiosity, confidence, and communication on the first day. In a secure and encouraging setting, nursing students worked closely with the pupils to help them develop critical social and intellectual skills. Students were encouraged to express themselves confidently and to develop a positive sense of self

Training sessions centered on healthy behaviors, classroom cooperation, and emotional well-being were conducted on the second day. In addition to supporting learning objectives, the sessions were developed to encourage positive behaviors including resilience, teamwork, and emotional control. Students were able to understand important ideas through engaging and exciting presentations that kept the atmosphere lively and pleasurable

This experiment demonstrated the significant influence that a supportive school environment has on how a student grows. 

Pharmacy Organized 9th National Pharmacy Workshop on Diabetes

The Faculty of Pharmacy at Tishk International University, in collaboration with Shar Hospital and Getz Pharma, hosted a National Pharmacy Workshop on Diabetes entitled “Better Patient Care Through Physician and Pharmacist Collaboration” on November 17, 2024. The workshop aimed to enhance diabetes management through teamwork among healthcare professionals, focusing on improving health outcomes, raising awareness about early diagnosis, and effective management strategies.

The event was introduced by Asst. Lecturer, Dr. Shajwan Salar, who highlighted the global burden of diabetes with recent statistics. Asst. Prof Dr. Idris Hadi, Head of the Board of Trustees, gave a welcoming speech. Asst. Prof. Dr. Sultan Abu Orabi, President of TIU, highlighted the importance of health awareness and diet for the management of diabetes. Asst. Prof. Dr. Abdulsamad Salahuddin, The Dean of the Faculty of Pharmacy, gave an overview of diabetes and its challenges, stressing the importance of ongoing education.

In the first session, Dr. Karzan M. Autism Care and Awareness Community Service Project

Initiated on October 6th, 2022, and accomplished on May 18th, 2023, the Faculty of Pharmacy at Tishk International University (TIU) successfully implemented this year's Autism Care and Awareness Community Service Project. The project was carried out under the supervision of Dr. Rozhan Arif, the Dean of Students Representative and Coordinator of the Faculty of Pharmacy, along with Research Assistants Dr. Saya Ameer and Dr. Sarmad Jabbar, as well as other supervisors including Dr. Ibrahim Khudhair, Dr. Omar Najmaddin, and Dr. Mohammed Sultan. Numerous volunteers from different grades also participated in the project.

Each year, the organizers of this project plan a series of activities aimed at raising awareness, understanding, and acceptance of autistic individuals. These activities span over several months and involve a range of preparations, workshops, fundraising events, and visits to autism centers to enable students to engage with and witness the daily struggles of those affected.

The project began by obtaining permission from the center's director on October 6th, 2022, to commence the project and coordinate access. Organizers established a communication group with volunteers, assigning responsibilities and distributing tasks. Meetings were held with the volunteers to design brochures, assign tasks, and schedule activities including shopping.

One of the key events was a fundraising event held on February 22nd, 2023, aimed at gathering support and financial aid from TIU students, staff, and external individuals. Faculty-student volunteers worked diligently to collect funds through various activities, such as selling homemade foods and handicrafts, providing henna designs, conducting competitions, and offering blood pressure, blood sugar, and body mass index measurements. TIU Presidency, staff members, and students enthusiastically visited the stands and made significant contributions to the fundraising efforts.

On March 30th, a group of volunteer students from the faculty, accompanied by their supervisor, Dr. Saya Ameer, went shopping to purchase stationery items for autistic children at an Autism Center in Erbil. The students and supervisors packed the bags with the items, prepared sweets, and adorned the center with balloons and other decorations ahead of the ceremony held on April 2nd, which coincided with World Autism Day.

During the ceremony on April 2nd, nearly 17 volunteer students, along with supervisors and other doctors, including the Dean and Head of Department, visited the Autism Center. The event took place in the presence of the children, their families, and invited guests. Brochures containing practical advice on caring for autistic children were distributed to parents, aiming to provide them with support and guidance.

The event included various activities organized by the volunteers to engage and entertain the autistic children and their families. These activities encompassed face painting, hand printing, and other interactive experiences, allowing the children to express themselves creatively and enjoy the event. The success of the project was evident as the children and their families expressed their gratitude for the volunteers' efforts and the Faculty of Pharmacy's involvement.

Finally, on May 18th, 2023, the Pharmacy Faculty arranged a final and comprehensive visit to the center to deliver all the gifts prepared for the autistic children and their teachers. These gifts included specialized toys and exercises tailored to each child's autism and cognitive impairment level. Students also had the opportunity to engage in various activities with the autistic children throughout the day.

We hope that all the goals and objectives of this project have been achieved. The project serves as a motivation for our students to care for and raise awareness about autism within our community. Continued collaboration and contributions are essential to further develop the educational support for autistic children and meet their specific needs.

5th National Tishk Pharmaceutical Conference

The Faculty of Pharmacy at Tishk International University organized educational visits to Bio Labs, Erbil, an advanced biomedical laboratory. The visits took place over six weeks on October 30, November 6 & 27, and December 4, 11 & 17, 2024.

These visits aimed to provide pharmacy students with practical exposure to laboratory equipment and techniques essential for modern diagnostics. Guided by Dr. Dania Awni Kamal, students were introduced to devices such as spectrophotometers, hematology analyzers, and centrifuge machines. The laboratory staff demonstrated how diagnostic tests are performed and explained the function and importance of each device. Students also gained insights into equipment calibration, accuracy, and maintenance.

This initiative successfully bridged the gap between theoretical knowledge and real-world applications, helping students understand the role of biomedical technology in healthcare. The visit was facilitated by Dr. Abdulsamad Salahuddin, Dean of the Faculty of Pharmacy, and Dr. Mohammad Javed Naim, Head of the Pharmacy Department.

On February 6, 2025, the Faculty of Pharmacy at Tishk International University organized the 7th International Pharmacy Workshop (IPW) to mark World Cancer Day. The workshop's theme was "Recent Progress in Diagnosis and Treatment of Cancer," and it was held in collaboration with Takvin and Amr Lab.

The event began with a welcome speech by Prof. Dr. Sultan Abu Orabi, President of TIU. Asst. Prof. Dr. Abdulsamad Salahuddin, Dean of the Faculty of Pharmacy, introduced the workshop's theme, emphasizing the need for continuous research.

The first session featured three speakers:

Dr. Luqman Rahman, Assistant Professor in Oncology, spoke about "From Awareness to Action: Empowering the Next Generation in the Fight Against Cancer."

Dr. Suzan Hoshyar, Director of the Breast Center and Adjunct Faculty at UKH, presented "Breast Cancer - We Can Fight It, It Is Not a Death Sentence."

Dr. Fahad Abdulwahab, a Hematopathologist, gave a talk on "Delivery of Advanced Hemato-Oncological Lab Tests to Those in Need: Creativity, Communication, Collaboration."

The second session featured two online keynote speakers:

Dr. Amin Malik from Research LTD discussed "Botanical Drugs for Cancer Therapy."

Dr. Hassan A. Rathore, Associate Professor of Pharmaceutical Sciences, presented "Molecular Mechanisms in Lung Adenocarcinoma."
